WABA NUN-NUNG GOSPEL CHAPEL

The last three months have presented many blessings and some obstacles to overcome. In July the mission had summer camp. About 60 children came and heard the gospel. The theme of camp was rejoicing. The joy of the Lord is greatly needed in communities that are so often grieving.

On Sunday morning we have finished our study of the Olivet discourse and are now transitioning into the



events and details surrounding the death and resurrection of Christ, the climax of the gospel. In the pantry ministry we were able to connect and pray with many people, and by God's grace we were able to witness to one young couple. In the men's group we studied our role as fathers, learning how to relate biblically to our sons and daughters.

God continued to work in and through the jail ministry. I was teaching during July and September. It has been a blessing to see men and women come out who are interested in studying the Scripture. The Spirit of God has been at work, and some have shared how the passage I was teaching related to what Micah had been teaching. Since Micah and I don't coordinate our lessons, it is obvious the Spirit was at work. Others testified that they were understanding passages they had not understood before. We have been able to give out many Bibles and see God at work.

In July at the jail, we started out with one class of 5 and ended up with 4 classes by the end of the month totaling 16. So far in September God has given 8 men who want to study. Since it is a county jail, no one stays for more than ninety days, so each month I go in I am working with a completely new group of people. I recently met one of my Bible study students from the prison ministry on the outside. So far, she is doing well, walking with God and staying free of addiction. Praise God.

We met some challenges and setbacks in August. I had surgery for a kidney stone on August 6th and there were complications. This, along with a stomach ailment, put me down for a couple of weeks. I have been able to resume some ministries but not all of it. I am still preaching in church on Sunday morning and teaching in the jail, however I have not yet recovered sufficiently to resume the men's fellowship and pantry. I have two more surgeries coming up, eye surgery on September 9th and another related to the kidney surgery that has not yet been scheduled. Our prayer is that these will go smoothly without complications, and I will be able to quickly resume a full schedule of ministry. We greatly appreciate your ongoing prayer and support.

It's already September! Where did the time go? It seems like only yesterday we were anticipating our upcoming summer ministry events and here we are, remembering how great of a summer it was. Praise God we had a great and busy summer! We were able to work with over 120 different youth and give them opportunities to hear the Word of God on multiple occasions!

Our summer started out with a VBS at the church in Stone Lake. Our friends from Village Church of Bartlett came and helped out. We had over 30 kids during the week and got some much-needed work done around the property. It's always nice to have folks who partner with us for the long haul. They have been coming here for almost 10 years.

Our next event was another VBS, this time at the church in Mole Lake. We had a group from the Cleveland area come and help out. We had 20 kids attend, and the group also helped with some work projects as well.



After that we took some older teens and headed down to WLS (Warrior Leadership Summit). We spent the week at a camp for native youth and young adults. There were over 500 gathered there during the week! The Gospel was heard many times, and some great steps were taken towards a deeper understanding of walking with God. We hope to take several more next year.

As soon as we got back from WLS we went straight into our annual overnight camp! One of the most fun weeks (for me at least) during the summer!

We had 63 campers this year, and the week went great. We had great help from some of our family from Ohio, folks from Village Church, some local teens, a local family and church family! Many thanks to everyone who pitched in! It takes a great team trusting God to make the week go smoothly.

After that we had a great outreach event for a wide range of youth at our facility, with kids from 4-18 attending. A group from Michigan came and helped out. We had 47 kids during the week!

Next up we did another VBS at our facility for the younger kids. Another team from Michigan came and helped out and we had 40 kids attend.

We got to spend a great deal of time with the youth this summer. It was busier than the past few years for sure but was an absolute blessing to be able to build relationships and meet new kids and share God's Word in the process.

We also started our weekly youth group again praise God! We've had a great group of teens to hang out with. We've gone on a few day trips and had a few gatherings at our facility. 

John 14:6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me. As we have been studying John, I have been blessed with the opportunity to study and talk about this verse multiple times during sermons and Bible studies in various locations. What an encouragement it is to know that Jesus is our path, the originator of truth, and the example of life that we model as we walk towards that eternal life promised to the children of God. What a blessing!

Seminary is coming to a close with only a few weeks left before I complete my master's degree in October. I am thankful for what I have learned and been able to apply in ministry these last two years. Pastor Jensen and I alternate every other month working in the jail where we are encouraged to see men and women seeking out biblical wisdom while they fulfill their legal obligations. We typically have two or three hour-long sessions as we meet with those inmates who have signed up. Some inmates are not allowed to attend services with other inmates, and men and women are segregated so we hold multiple sessions weekly. I am thankful for the jail ministry as it forces me to rely increasingly on Scripture and the Holy Spirit to guide and inspire. Bible study started back up this fall and we have been working our way through the chapters in John that tell of Jesus' teaching during the Last Supper. I have helped fill the pulpit in Mole Lake and Lake Lucerne Gospel Chapel as needed this summer.

Michelle has begun harvesting the bounty of her garden and enjoying her time outside in this warm fall weather. She has picked and made jam from the buckets of blackberries she gathered this summer and has her harvest of drying herbs and leaves hanging all over the house. She has begun dehydrating apple slices among other things to preserve for the long winter. She makes and gives away various personal blends of tea to anyone who will have them. Our house resembles an eighteenth-century apothecary much of the year and always smells amazing. Chase, Brooke, Erin and newest addition Willow (born Aug. 17th), come over for lunch after church every Sunday. Sometimes Uncle Jonah stops by to visit. It is a blessing to have the kids live so close and be able to visit with them often.

Our youngest son, Jonah (22), has enjoyed his job operating equipment for a local company that does cement and dirt work. His goals in high school were to be an equipment operator and he has worked steadily to move in that direction, holding various jobs until something in that field opened up. He rents a house with a friend that works for the same company. Whenever he isn't working, he spends his time in the woods in pursuit of everything that walks, runs, flies, or swims. He keeps our freezer stocked with meat and we are grateful.

Our oldest son, Chase (26), his wife Brooke, and daughters Erin (20 months), Willow (1 month) are all doing well. Brooke is on maternity leave for the next several months and has the option to work from home when she needs to and has daycare for the girls when she needs to go into the office. We have enjoyed getting to spend time with them this summer. Brooke's job as an accountant has kept her busy. Chase's work as a machinist keeps him hopping. We are praising God for a growing healthy family!

Things at the shelter have been busy this summer. We currently have 3 single adults and 1 family of 2 in

our Emergency Shelter program. We have 1 single male in our Transitional Housing program, and he has been incredibly helpful managing our clothing recycling program and helping maintain our facility. The building we have leased since 2012 for our TH program was recently sold so we are praying about what that program is going to look like in the future. In August we completed our 14th year and God remains faithful in supplying our needs!

All of our funding comes from small local churches, individual contributions, charitable groups, and private corporate grants, all of which are a blessing as we trust in God's provision! As always, we are praying that God continues to guide and direct this project and we trust His hand in all things. Thank you for your prayers and support!
